VISION

To offer children, families, and community members a welcoming place to improve their overall well-being through health promotion, prevention, and early intervention programs. The Mental Health Center of Denver offers treatment services that are evidence-based and strength-focused, allowing for the highest quality of impact and outcomes for parents, children, and our community.



- To prevent problems by strengthening the individual, family, and community assets that young people have in their lives
- To build a caring and supportive community that is protective for youth
- To connect teens to their families so they can be protected against behaviors that put their health at risk such as alcohol, tobacco, other drug use, emotional distress, violence, and risky sexual behavior
- To foster creativity and imagination in children that helps them overcome adversity, trauma, and risk















Collective IMPACT

In partnership with community stakeholders, the Mental Health Center of Denver will create a hub of community activity and services by providing a range of programs under one roof. A large spectrum of services will center around:

- Mental Health increasing access to quality behavioral healthcare
- Healthcare coordinating access to physical and dental healthcare
- **Education** promoting school readiness and student achievement with early childhood education and support as well as a specialty day treatment program
- Community promoting engagement, well-being, and access to healthy food

Value for Our COMMUNITY

This transformative project builds a foundation of mental wellness essential to children, families, and community. The Mental Health Center of Denver brings its expertise and collaborative spirit onto a four acre site in northeast Denver. Here, at 35th Avenue and Dahlia,



the community center serves as the epicenter for the wide array of community-based behavioral health programs for the Mental Health Center of Denver and its countless community partners. More than 33,000 square feet of indoor classroom, play, community, and counseling space will be enhanced by outdoor play areas, therapeutic gardens, and an urban farm to bring together the care and compassion essential to make a community flourish.




