Regulation of Providers. The practice of licensed, certified, or registered persons in the field of psychotherapy is regulated by the Colorado Department of Regulatory Agencies, Division of Professions and Occupations. The address is 1560 Broadway, Suite 1350, Denver, CO 80202, and the telephone number is 303-894-7800. The regulatory requirements that apply to mental health professionals are as follows:

- Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW), Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist (LMFT), and Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC) must hold a master's degree in their profession and have two years of post-master's supervision.
- Licensed Social Worker must hold a master's degree in social work.
- Licensed Psychologist must hold a doctorate degree in psychology and have one year of post-doctoral supervision.
- Psychologist Candidate, Marriage and Family Therapist Candidate, and Licensed Professional Counselor Candidate must hold the necessary licensing degree and be in the process of completing the required supervision for licensure.
- Certified Addiction Technician (CAT) must have a high school diploma or equivalent, complete required course work and trainings, and complete 1,000 hours of supervised experience.
- Certified addiction specialist (CAS) must hold a bachelor's degree in a behavioral health concentration, complete required course work and trainings, and complete 2,000 hours of supervised experience.
- Licensed Addiction Counselor (LAC) must hold a master's or doctorate degree in the behavioral health sciences, complete required course work and trainings, and complete 3,000 hours of supervised experience.
- Unlicensed Psychotherapist is a psychotherapist listed in the database of the State Board of Unlicensed Psychotherapists, is authorized but not licensed to practice psychotherapy, and is not required to satisfy any standardized educational or testing requirements from the State.

Confidentiality. The information provided by you during therapy sessions is legally confidential and cannot be disclosed without your permission. Exceptions to the general rule of confidentiality include: lawsuits against the clinician or WellPower; complaints, disciplinary proceedings, and reviews of professional conduct; reporting of abuse or neglect of a child, an elder, or an at-risk adult; and duty to warn of serious threat or physical violence to yourself, a specific person other than yourself, or a specific location. Other exceptions will be identified to you as those situations arise during therapy.

Your Rights. You are entitled to receive information about the methods of therapy, the techniques used, the duration of therapy (if known), and the fee structure. You may request the name and credentials of any individual providing psychotherapy services to you. Please ask if you would like to receive any of this information. You may seek a second opinion from another clinician outside of WellPower; you will be responsible for the cost and arrangements. You may request a second opinion from another clinician within WellPower; we are not required to grant your request. You may terminate therapy at any time. If there are issues related to the working relationship with your clinician, we ask that you work together to come up with a solution. The relationship between you and your clinician is a professional relationship. Sexual intimacy is never appropriate in a professional relationship. If sexual intimacy occurs, it should be reported to the Division of Professions and Occupations, whose address and telephone number are provided above.

Records Retention. Mental health professionals are required to maintain records of the people they serve, 18 years of age and older, for a period of seven (7) years from the date of termination of services. WellPower will maintain your records for the required period. If you feel we have violated the law regarding maintenance of records, you must file your complaint or other notice with the Division of Professions and Occupations within seven (7) years after you discover or reasonably should have discovered the violation. Please be advised that WellPower may not keep (may destroy) your records after the seven-year period.
